

August 2024 Saint Louis University/YouGov Poll Results

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Saint Louis University and YouGov surveyed 900 likely Missouri voters from August 8 to August 16 about the 2024 election, current political issues, and education policy in Missouri. The following pages present results for most survey questions. The margin of error for survey results for the full sample is 3.79%. Funding and Support

The August 2024 SLU/YouGov Poll was funded by the PRiME Center, an independent

The weights were then post-stratified on 2020 presidential vote choice as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (3-categories), and education (4-categories). The weighted dataset of registered MO voters was then subsetted on likely MO voters, and the weights were trimmed and recentered around 1, to produce the final weights for likely Missouri voters.

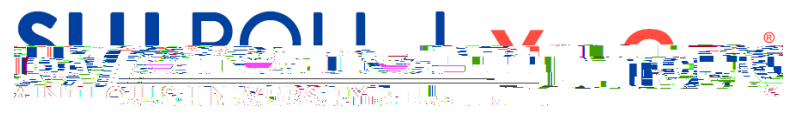

Do you approve or disapprove of the way each is doing their job...The US Supreme Court?

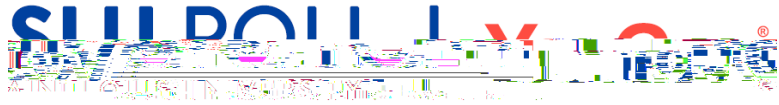

Do you approve or disapprove of the way each is doing their job...The Missouri State Legislature?

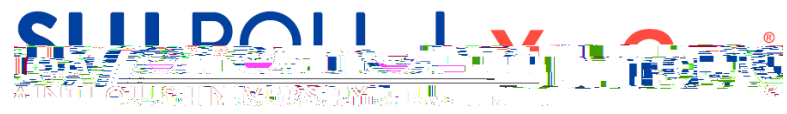

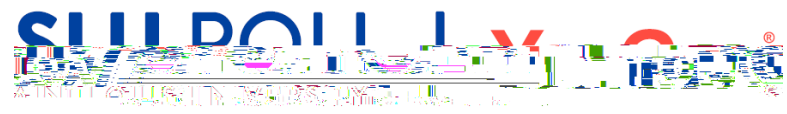


Do you approve or disapprove of the way each is doing their job...Senator Eric Schmitt?

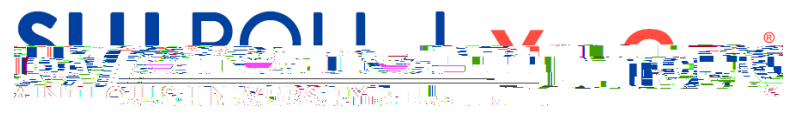

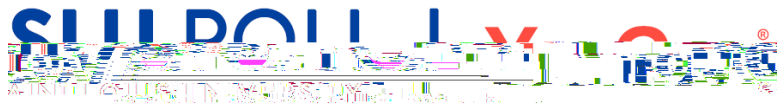

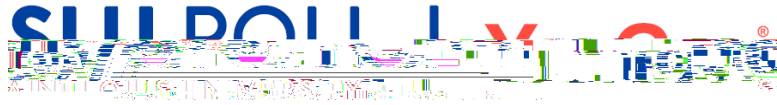


Do you agree or disagree with the following statements...The State of Missouri is on the right track and headed in a good direction?

What do you think the hourly minimum wage salary in the state of Missouri should be?

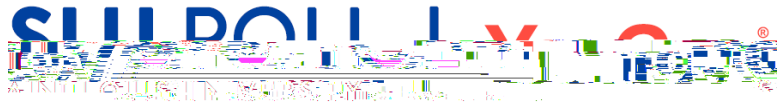

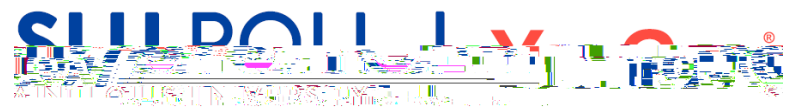
